**MATTERS FROM THE PUBLIC:**

Anita Manning, expressed concern about snow plowed onto sidewalks on the east side of Division Ave. at Spruce St.

**Approval of Minutes:**

**New Business:**

1. Safe Routes to Schools:

Matt brought copies of a survey LPOSD did with parents about walking and biking to schools. The mechanics of the survey were discussed, then Matt called attention to some of the written comments. Molly moved, Anne seconded: Rebecca and Matt go to City Council regarding safety difficulties for students walking and biking to schools and ask Council if they would welcome recommendations from PBAC. **Motion passed unanimously.**

2. Intersection of First Ave, Bridge St and Church

Anne expressed concern about both vehicles and pedestrians navigating the oval-about at this intersection. Bruce offered history about the corner and assurances that the design is under consideration. PBAC requested that they be allowed to review the draft design for this intersection.
